Dr. Francisco (Paco) Martorell is a professor and chair of the Graduate Group in Education at the UC Davis School of Education. He has broad research interests in both higher education and K-12 policy. Current projects cover areas including developmental education in colleges, the effects of grade retention, the returns to forprofit colleges, the impacts of school facility investments, and community college tuition subsidies. He also has conducted research on health care including studies examining the economic costs of dementia as well as research on the economic and educational consequences of military service.

Dr. Martorell joined the UC Davis School of Education faculty as an assistant professor in 2014, and was previously an economist at the RAND Corporation and a professor at the Pardee RAND Graduate School. He earned his PhD in economics at UC Berkeley, and his BA in economics and mathematics at Carleton College.
