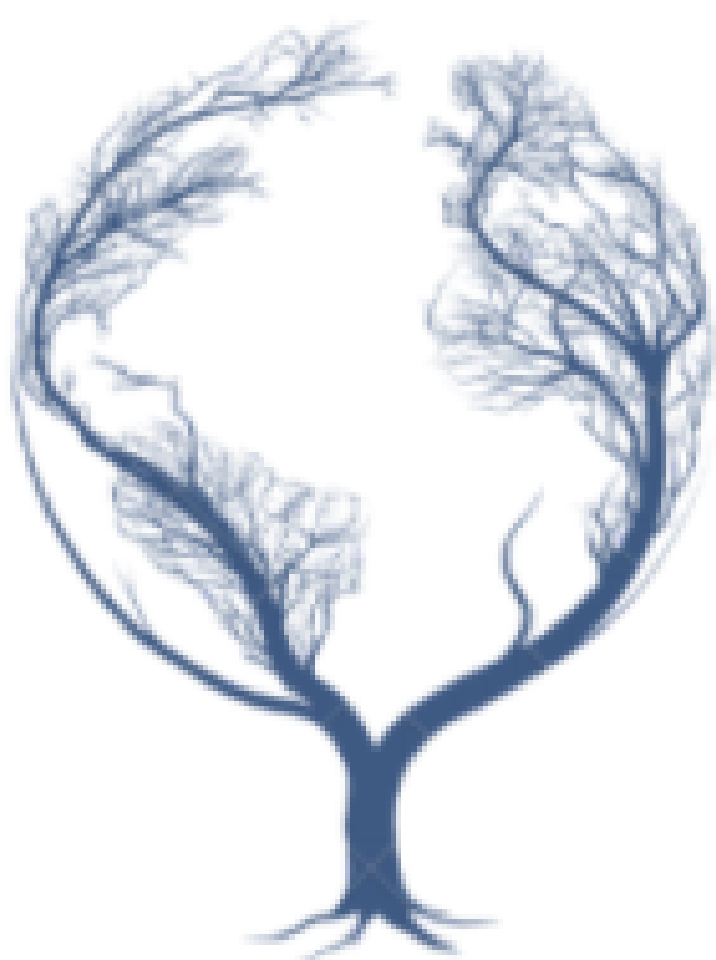
Citizen Science in Teacher Education: Increasing Rigor, Relevance, and Representation in Science Education
