

# **COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS**

The mission of College Opportunity Programs (COP) is to increase student preparation for postsecondary opportunities through academic enrichment, academic advising, motivational activities and K-12 partnerships. COP is housed in the School of Education's Resourcing Excellence in Education (REEd) Center.

COP's three federally funded programs—Educational Talent Search, **GEAR UP and Upward Bound**—serve middle and high school students in Colusa, Glenn, Sacramento, Shasta, Siskiyou, Solano, Tehama and Yolo counties. Nearly all participating students are from low-income families, are potential first-generation college students, and/or live in regions struggling with poverty, unemployment, and low rates of high school completion and postsecondary education.
