THE GRADUATE GROUP IN EDUCATION

The UC Davis Graduate Group in Education Ph.D. program is an ideal choice for prospective students interested in engaging scholarship, interdisciplinary inquiry and opportunities to produce impactful research.

- > The Graduate Group in Education faculty includes 30 researchers from the School of Education and 30 additional faculty members from campus professional schools and departments.
- > Ph.D. students conduct **research** at various labs and centers on campus. These include those housed at the School of Education, such as the Center for Community and Citizen Science and Wheelhouse: The Center for Community College Leadership and Research, as well as interdisciplinary campus research centers like the UC Davis MIND Institute and the Center for Poverty Research.
- > The Graduate Group in Education provides strong student support through a variety of funding opportunities. - > Statement of Purpose and Personal History
- > Three letters of recommendation
- > Writing sample
- > GRE General Test scores
- > Satisfactory TOEFL or IELTS score (International applicants)
